From Great St Mary's Church, we will head to the river, where we will pick up a path to take us behind the Botanic Gardens. We'll then head back to Trumpington Road, leading us to the village of Trumpington. We'll then follow the winding country lane past Byron's pool to Grantchester, where notable intellectuals of the early 20th century gathered for discussion and bucolic inspiration. After stopping for refreshment at the village tea rooms or a pub, we will follow the footpath along the river back to Cambridge, via Newnham.

After exploring the parkland we exit the grounds along the grand Wimpole Avenue before taking the Harcamlow Way to Whaddon and continuing to Meldreth for the train home.

We will then follow the Peter Scott Walk along the Ouse to the sea. From there, we will ramble along the edge of the Wash National Nature Reserve, an important winter feeding ground for wetland birds. We will pass by the picturesque Scott's Lighthouse before catching the bus back to King's Lynn.
