 A gentle stroll through Grantchester Meadows to Byron's Pool and back along Hobson's Brook.

Sunday 18th October      THE HEMINGFORDS AND ST. IVES      10 miles  
 Visiting these picturesque villages on the Great Ouse and the well-known bridge and chapel at St. Ives.      (Bus back:Fenstanton)  
 Meet at Drummer St. at 10.20am. for 151 bus to Fenstanton.

Saturday 24th October      THE GRANTA VALLEY      8 miles  
 Along the Granta from Linton negotiating the Clapper Stile, one of the few left in Britain.  
 Meet at Drummer St. for 113 bus to Linton at 1.05pm. (Bus back:Stapleford)

Sunday 1st November      RAVENSBURGH CASTLE      16 miles  
 Real hills at last as we tackle the Eastern Chilterns.  
 Meet at the railway station for the 9.57 train to Hitchin.  
 (Train back:Hitchin)

Saturday 7th November      ANGLESEY ABBEY      8 miles  
 From this 13th-Century Augustian abbey we encounter our first fenland and enter into Cambridge along the Cam.  
 Meet at Drummer St. at 12.55pm. for 111 bus to Lode.

Sunday 15th November      SAFFRON WALDEN AND LINTON      10-14 miles  
 Through the rolling chalk country of the East Anglian Heights.      (Bus back:  
 Meet at the railway station for the 10.20 train to Audley End.      Linton)

Saturday 21st November      AMERICAN CEMETERY      7 miles  
 Through the local villages of Coton and Wadingley to the West.  
 Meet at Garret Hostel Lane Bridge at 1.30pm.      (Bus back:Bar Hill)

Sunday 29th November      EAST ANGLIAN HEIGHTS      15 miles  
 Ascending to the highest point of these hills at Therfield and visiting the medieval villages of Reed and Barkway, and the pub-sign at Barley.  
 Meet at the railway station for the 9.57 train to Royston.  
 (Train back:Royston)
