We are an informal group which rambles at weekends during Full Term (this term there is a gap for exams). There is no subscription, so new members are welcome at any time. Simply turn up at the meeting place detailed below, with strong boots or shoes, waterproofs, money for any travel fare and, on Sundays, some food and drink (we are not always able to find anywhere to buy meals).

Sunday 30th April: Cambridge to Ely (~17 Miles)

Along the river to this historic city with a large cathedral, the architecture of which Engineering lecturers regularly enthuse about, helping greatly the insomniacs amongst us. Meet by the Pike & Eel pub (ask a boatie where it is) at 10:00. Train back: Ely.

Saturday 6th May: OXFAM Walk.

Sunday 14th May: Godmanchester to Fenstanton (11 Miles)

Saturday 20th May: Whittlesford to Shepreth (8 Miles)

This is the one that was completely rained off last term, resurrected with *no egg on face*, I hope. Work it out for yourself.....Train 12:25 to Whittlesford. Return train: Shepreth.
