Sunday 16 October **Introductory Ramble to Granchester** **6 miles**
Out along the Cam to Granchester, a charming village immortalized by Rupert Brooke. Back via Bryon's Pool and Trumpington. Departing from Mill Lane bridge (opposite the Mill) at 13.30. A very easy walk.

Sunday 30 October **West Cambridgeshire Villages** **11 miles**
From Hardwick we walk to the villages of Toft and Coberton, which have some fine medieval churches. We then head back via Coton, getting some good views of Cambridge along the way. The paths could be quite muddy.
Out: Bus at 11.30 to Hardwick **Back at about 18.00.**

Sunday 13 November **Meadows and Mills around St Ives** **9 miles**
A ramble through the best of Cambridgeshire's countryside, with lazy meadows and reed-fringed river.
Out: Bus at 10.05 to St Ives. **Back: Bus at 15.21 (or 17.21) from St Ives, arriving Cambridge at 15.59 (17.59).**
