From Hertford North station, we take a northerly route out of Hertford following the River Beane. We then join the Hertfordshire Way, and continue past Stapleford and through Chesterbolt Wood up to Home Farm, where we turn to the west. After crossing a weir, we approach Watton at Stone, where we stop for lunch. We then follow the Chain Walk past Stocking Spring and into the more hilly, wooded countryside around Benington, before heading past High Wood and into Stevenage.

This longer walk will explore the gently undulating countryside between the estuaries of the Rivers Stour and Orwell in south-east Suffolk, starting early in order to make the most of the short winter day. From Ipswich railway station, we walk south past Alton Water Reservoir nature reserve and the village of Stutton before reaching the estuary of the River Stour. Lunch will be in Harkstead, and we then continue alongside the estuary to the tip of the peninsula at Shotley Gate. This village has a Martello tower, one of many watch-towers built during the Napoleonic Wars. A short walk then brings us to Shotley itself, from where we catch a bus back to Ipswich.
