**Saturday 9th October**                      **Introductory Ramble to Grantchester**                      6 miles

Out along the Cam to Grantchester, a charming and famous little village south of Cambridge, immortalised by Rupert Brooke. His name appears on the War Memorial in the churchyard. Back via Byron's Pool and Trumpington.

Meet at Mill Lane Bridge at 13.30.

**Sunday 24th October**                      **Cambridge to Ely**                      16 miles

For enthusiastic Ramblers. Our annual pilgrimage to Ely, following the banks of the Cam and the Great Ouse, ending at the magnificent cathedral with its beautiful Octagon and Lady Chapel, both recently restored.

Meet: Trinity College Great Gate at 10.30.

Back: Train at 18.00 from Ely, arriving Cambridge 18.16.

**Saturday 6th November**                      **Reach to Woodditton**                      8 miles

Along the Devil's Ditch, a great Anglo-Saxon defensive earthwork, watching the racehorses exercising on Newmarket Heath, to Woodditton with its lovely woodland setting and church with 15th C font and screen.

Out: Bus at 10.15 to Reach

Back: Train at 17.39 from Dullingham, arriving Cambridge 17.56.

**Sunday 21st November**                      **Addenbrookes to Linton**                      9 miles

Along a stretch of the very straight Roman Road "Via Devana". We also visit Wandlebury Ring, an Iron Age fortress site in the Gog Magog Hills.

Out: Meet at 10.00 at the bus-stop outside Addenbrookes Hospital

Back: Bus at 15.26 from Linton, arriving Cambridge 15.50.
